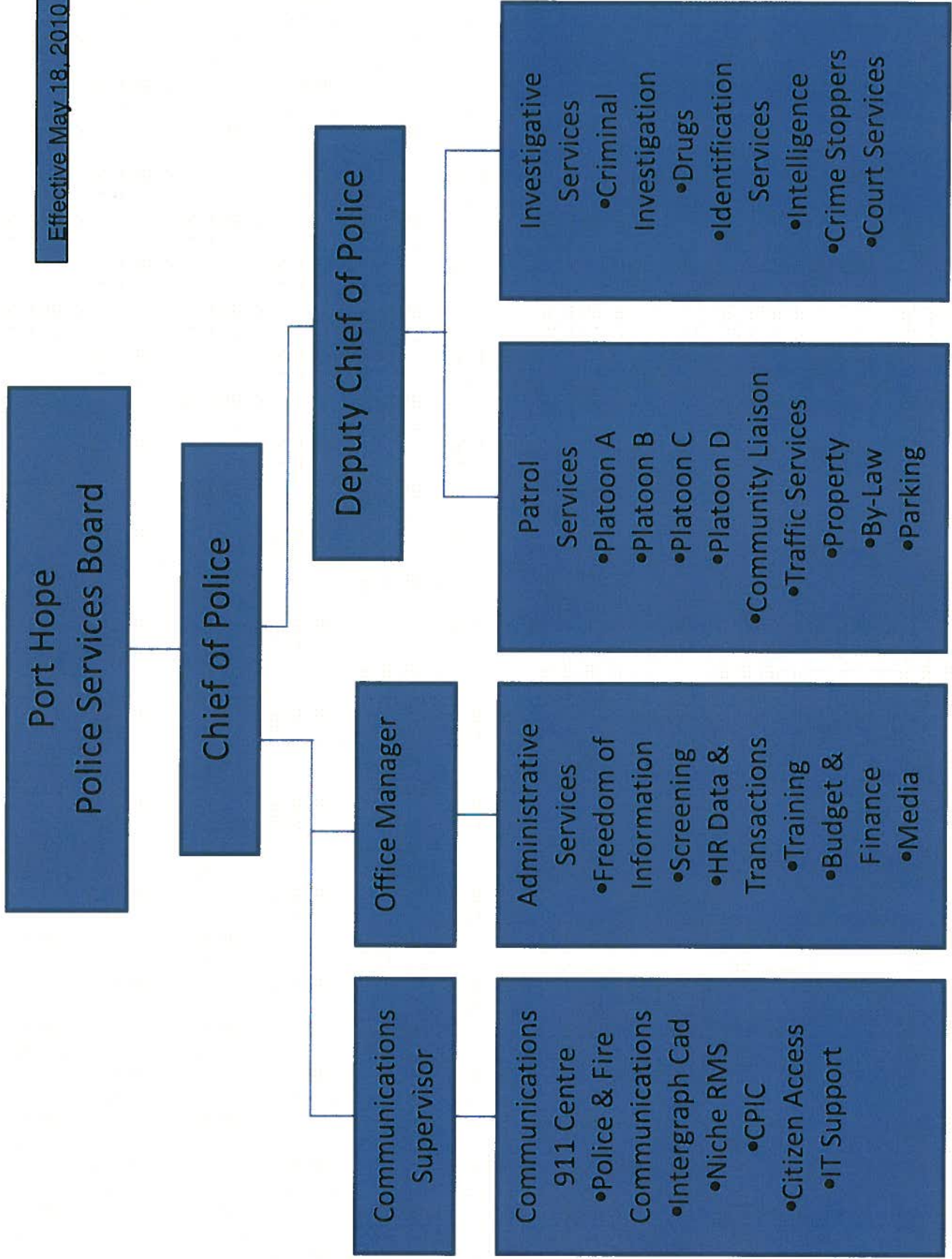
The detailed financial and crime reports are included herein as are the other statutory reports.

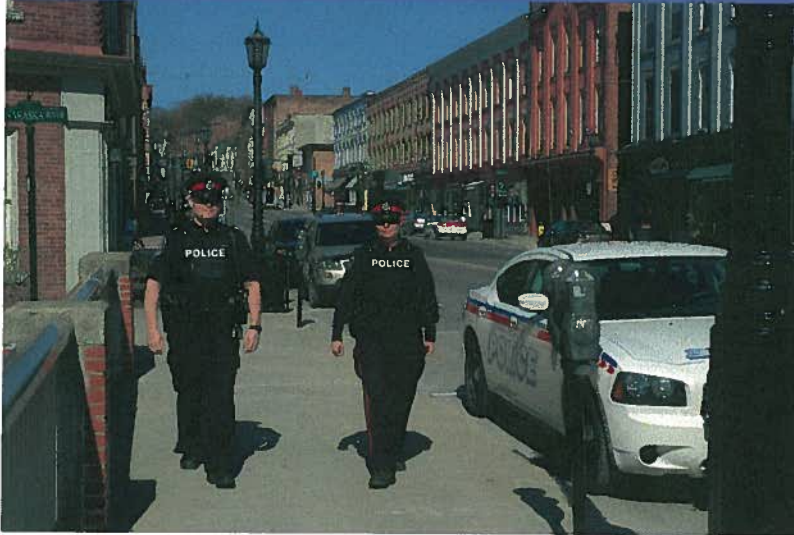

The Port Hope Police Service Cell Area was reopened with a cadre of part time cell monitors. This followed improvements to the cell monitoring equipment, the cell doors, the booking room and the installation of a work area for the cell monitors.

The Police Facility Project has commenced, with the approval by the Police Services Board of the budget required for the project. We are now moving forward with council to make this a reality.

The Criminal Record Screening Program had another successful year despite significant changes to the process as driven by the Government of Canada, through the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

The Community Services operation underwent a significant change with the appointment of Constable Marino to this role. Settling into this assignment and working hard to continue the tradition of his predecessor, Constable Marino has already developed a strong relationship with students and teachers alike.

Statistical Highlights

The following pages contain charts and maps detailing the crimes that occurred in 2010 as compared to 2009. The following are the most significant highlights:

Actual Criminal Occurrences increased from 577 in 2009 to 755 in 2010. A 30.8 percent increase.

The Criminal Clearance rate also increased by 5.3 percent to 59 percent of all reported crimes.

Increases in areas like Drug Enforcement which are primarily driven by officer activity, actually demonstrate our commitment to proactive community safety initiatives.

Calls for service also increased from 4,516 to 4,750, an increase of 5.18 percent. This is the most commonly used indicator of workload for the service and in particular for patrol officers. While this is a significant increase, our members were able to successfully manage these events and the increase in workload.

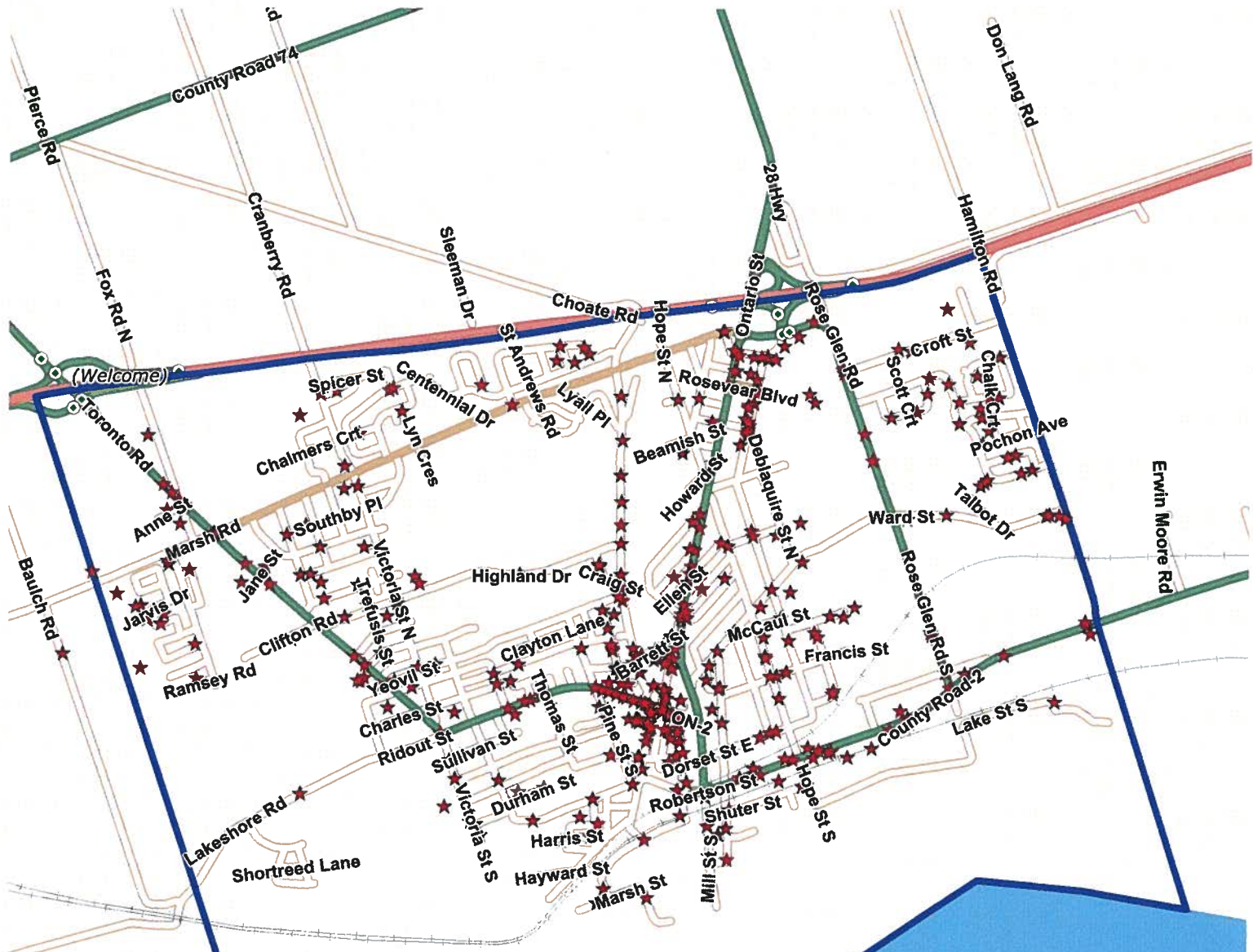

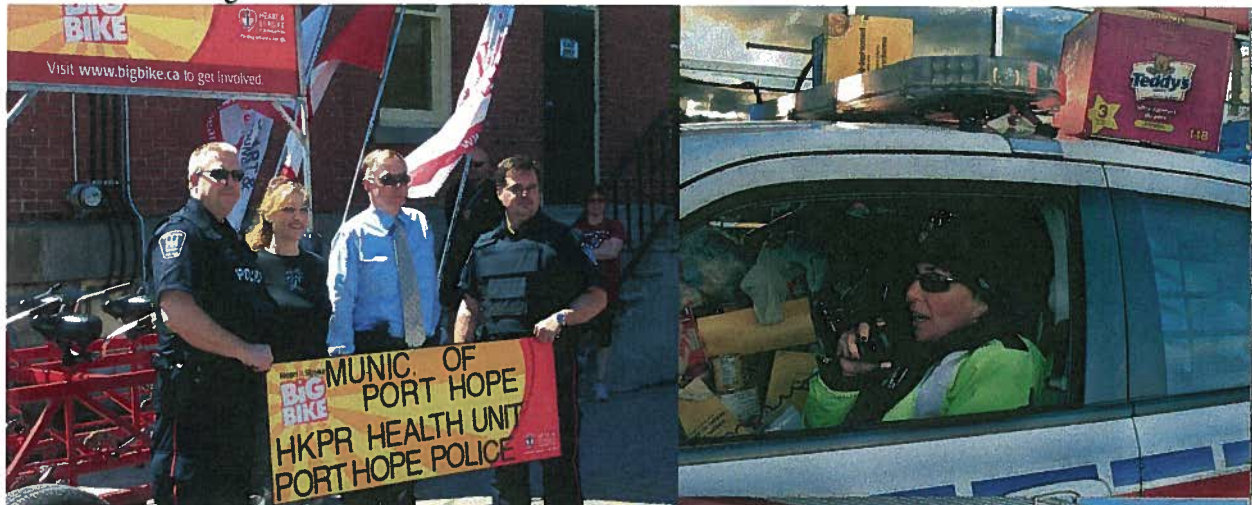

Budget

OPERATING

The 2010 Port Hope Police Service Budget was impacted by several significant events including legal fees, overtime, benefit costs and retiree benefits.

On the expense side, we expended 100.42% of the budget. In total, expenses were \$26,843 above budget.

Revenue was \$56,466 below budget in the Provincial Grants and Screening areas.

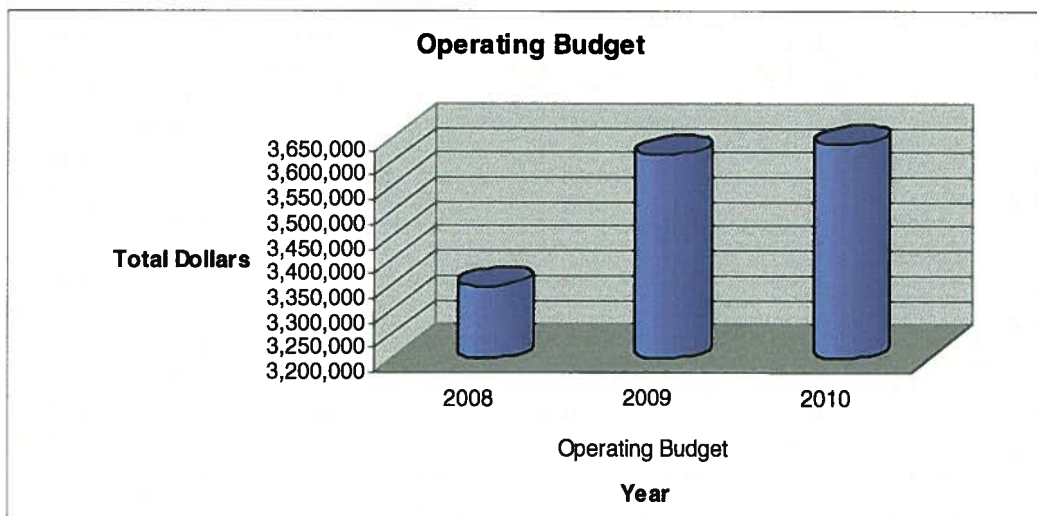
The result of the foregoing is a deficit of \$83,309.

CAPITAL

All of our capital projects were completed with the exception of Short Term Asset Replacement which is a 5 year allocation and the Radio Project which has been deferred. All of these projects were completed with costs being a total of \$148,657.22 below budget.

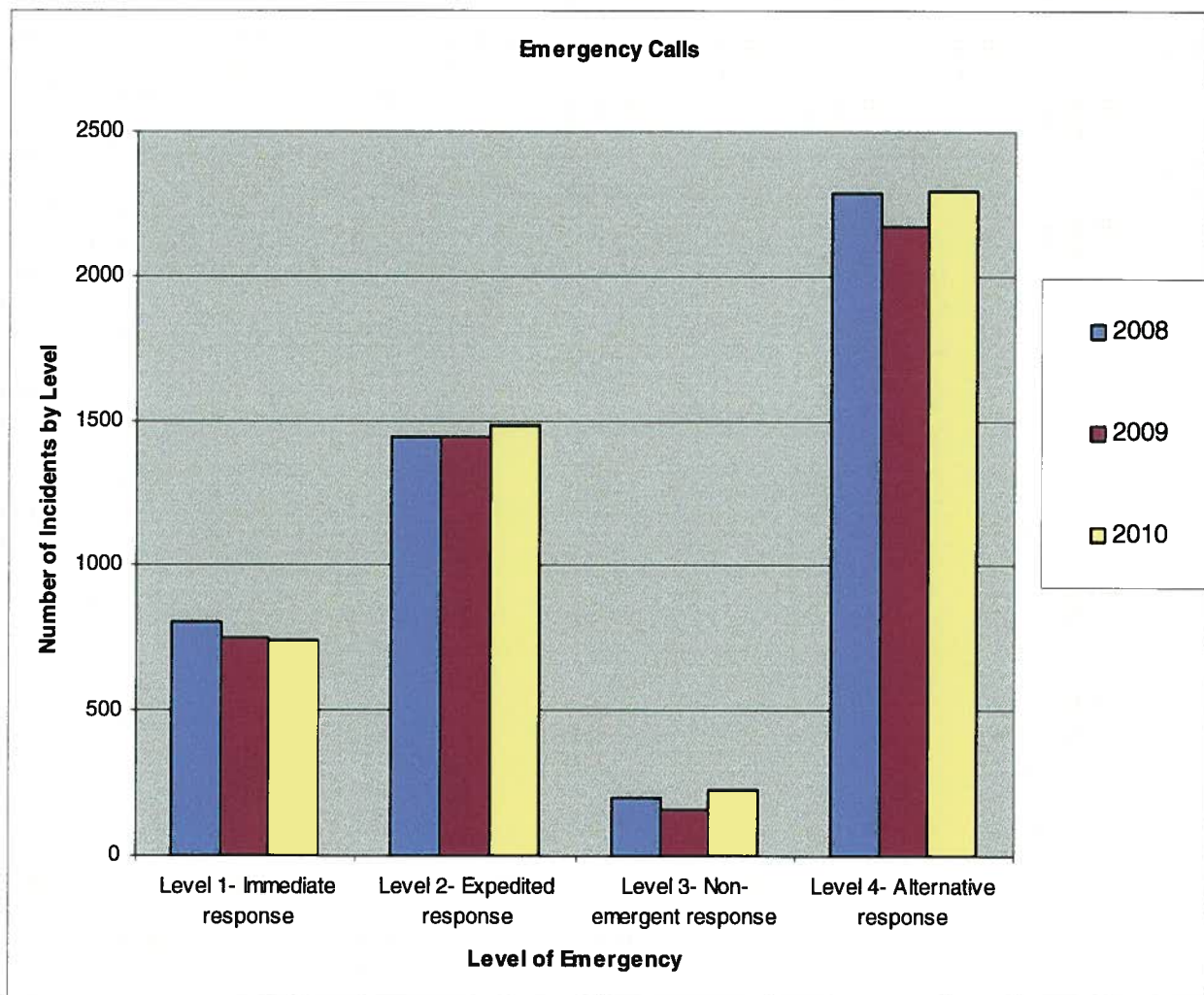

Public Complaints

In 2010 the Port Hope Police Service was the subject of three official complaints filed with the Office of the Independent Police Review Director. All of the complaints were resolved to the satisfaction of the OIPRD and the complainants.

Two of the complaints were withdrawn by the complainants after thorough investigations into the conduct of the officers were completed.

The third complaint was found to be unsubstantiated by the OIPRD and therefore no investigation of the actual complaint was required of the Port Hope Police Service.
