JACK BURGER REVITALIZATION

(Leisure Services Master Plan Recommendation 1.26, 3.4 & 3.5)

The Municipality of Port Hope, through the Department of Parks, Recreation and Culture is actively seeking to secure funding for the proposed improvements to the Jack Burger Sports Complex, including the addition of a fitness centre and improvements to support areas (e.g., family change room for the pool, access to the second floor for those with disabilities, community room and multi-purpose space, lobby, and administrative space). An application to the Enabling Accessibility Fund has been submitted. At the time of Leisure Guide publication no announcements regarding this fund had been made.

Staff are working to bring together the JBSC Revitalization Group and are seeking community members who may be interested in working together to establish a Business Plan and continue moving this project forward.

BAULCH ROAD PARK DEVELOPMENT

(Leisure Services Master Plan Recommendations 2.1, 3.14, 3.17, 3.26, 3.31 & 4.17)

The Municipality of Port Hope is developing active parkland (sports field) on 9 hectares of property leased from the Federal Government (Natural Resources Canada). The initial phases of planning and developing this park have begun. This project will include community consultations during the concept design and detail phases prior to construction.

ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION & TRAILS MASTER PLAN

(Leisure Services Master Plan Recommendations 1-15 to 1.17, 1.28, 3.13, 3.33, 4.16)

The initial draft plan included extensive community consultation including a stakeholder and a public meeting, presentation at Council and posting of the draft plan for public input (www.porthope.ca).
